

We went ahead with all our usual Christmas Services, although many churches decided to curtail some of them. The minister wanted people to know that we were open to celebrate the Birth of Jesus, and the Congregation did that at each of the Services! The sanctuary looked very festive with the Christmas Tree, decorated by Mr and Mrs Newlands, and the displays on the window sills, arranged by Mr and Mrs Eadie. The Treasurer

Dear Everyone,

Here we are at the beginning of another new year when we are still living under some restrictions. Who would have believed, at this time last year, that that would still be the case? Let us all hope and pray that 2022 will be better and see us being able to go out and about as we please.

My report this month is mainly an update on various items which have been dealt with in recent weeks. Some items are ongoing, but there is one very serious and worrying one which you should be aware of. There was an email to Congregational Treasurers from the Deputy Treasurer at the Church of Scotland headed "Fraud Awareness – Urgent" in which she states that a number of congregations have been targeted by fraudsters. Various pieces of advice are given to minimise the chances of any possible scamming. Our Church accounts are not administered via the internet and cheques etc. require two signatures. Although this email applies to Church Accounts, we all need to be aware of, and alert to, possible fraud in our personal accounts. I therefore urge you to be vigilant and careful.

The music licence charge is *still* being pursued. PPLPRS are asking us to pay for a music licence (royalties) for the halls when they were closed and, obviously, no music was being played in them. No response has been received to the emails they were sent and the commitment given in a telephone call has not been honoured. Over Christmas/New Year four invoices were received from them. None addressed the issue so all were returned with notes asking for explanations of amounts stated and answers to questions which have been asked on numerous occasions.

The Stewardship and Finance department at the Church of Scotland sent out their usual mailing at the end of the year. It contains forms which have to be completed and returned. The one for the bank has been completed and handed in and a confirmation note re-

ceived. It is the banker's order for our Ministries and Mission contribution which has reduced slightly this year from £42,754 in 2021 to £42,238 in 2022. The way in which Ministries and Mission contributions are calculated is changing from 2023 so it is to be hoped that our contribution will be reduced significantly. The forms which have to be returned to the Church of Scotland will be completed and sent when the bank statement is received and the relevant items totalled.

Preparations for the Annual Accounts has begun. The timeline from the Church of Scotland is the same as in previous years but, this year, there is an additional note that deadlines may change depending on what can be done safely if restrictions tighten. Also, the Accounts can be sent electronically. This year, our Accounts will be attested by Glasgow Presbytery.

An invoice was received from Initial, the company who service our hygiene bins. As we had a credit note which would cover it, they were asked to take payment from it. This they did.

Our Presbytery Dues (July 2021 to December 2021) for Glasgow Presbytery were paid (£989). They are significantly more than the amount we paid (£710 for the whole of the previous year) when we were in Falkirk Presbytery.

You will see from above that 2021 was another challenging year for our Church, financially. I thank sincerely all those of you who have contributed financially to our Church throughout the year and, in so doing, have helped it to survive.

It may seem a little late as you will not be reading this until the start of February, but I wish each and every one of you a Happy and Healthy 2022. Let us give thanks to God that we were able to worship in the Sanctuary for most of 2021 and pray that we will be able to continue to do so.

Scars for Life

Some years ago on a hot summer day in south Florida, a little boy decided to go for a swim in the old swimming hole behind his house. In a hurry to dive into the cool water, he ran out the back door, leaving behind shoes, socks, and shirt as he went. He flew into the water, not realising that as he swam toward the middle of the lake, an alligator was swimming toward the shore.

His mother in the house was looking out the window saw the two as they got closer together. In utter fear, she ran toward the water, yelling to her son as loudly as she could. Hearing her voice, the little boy became alarmed and made a U-turn to swim to his mother. It was too late. Just as he reached her, the alligator reached him.

From the dock, the mother grabbed her little boy by the arms just as the alligator snatched his legs. That began an incredible tug-of-war between the two. The alligator was much stronger than the mother, but he mother was much too passionate to let go.

A farmer happened to drive by, and hearing her screams, raced from his truck, took aim and shot the alligator. Remarkably, after weeks and weeks in hospital, the little boy survived. His legs were extremely scarred by the vicious attack of the animal.....and, on his arms deep scratches where his mother's fingernails dug into his flesh in her effort to hang on to the son she loved.

The newspaper who interviewed the boy after the trauma, asked if he would show him his scars. The boy lifted his trouser legs. And then, with obvious pride, he said to the reporter, "But look at my arms. I have great scars on my arms, too. I have them because my Mom wouldn't let go."

You and I can identify with that little boy. We have scars, too. No, not from an alligator, or anything quite so dramatic. But the scars of a painful past. Some of those scars are unsightly and have caused us deep regret. But, some wounds, my friend, are because God has refused to let go.

In the midst of your struggle, He's been there holding on to you. The Scripture teaches that God loves you. You are a child of God. He wants to protect you and provide for you in every way.

But sometimes we foolishly wade into dangerous situations. The swimming hole of life is filled with peril - and we forget that the enemy is waiting to attack.

That's when the tug-of-war begins - and if you have the scars of His love on your arms be very, very grateful. He did not and will not - let you go.




From now on, the North and South ends of the church will be utilised, and children will be baptised at both ends.




